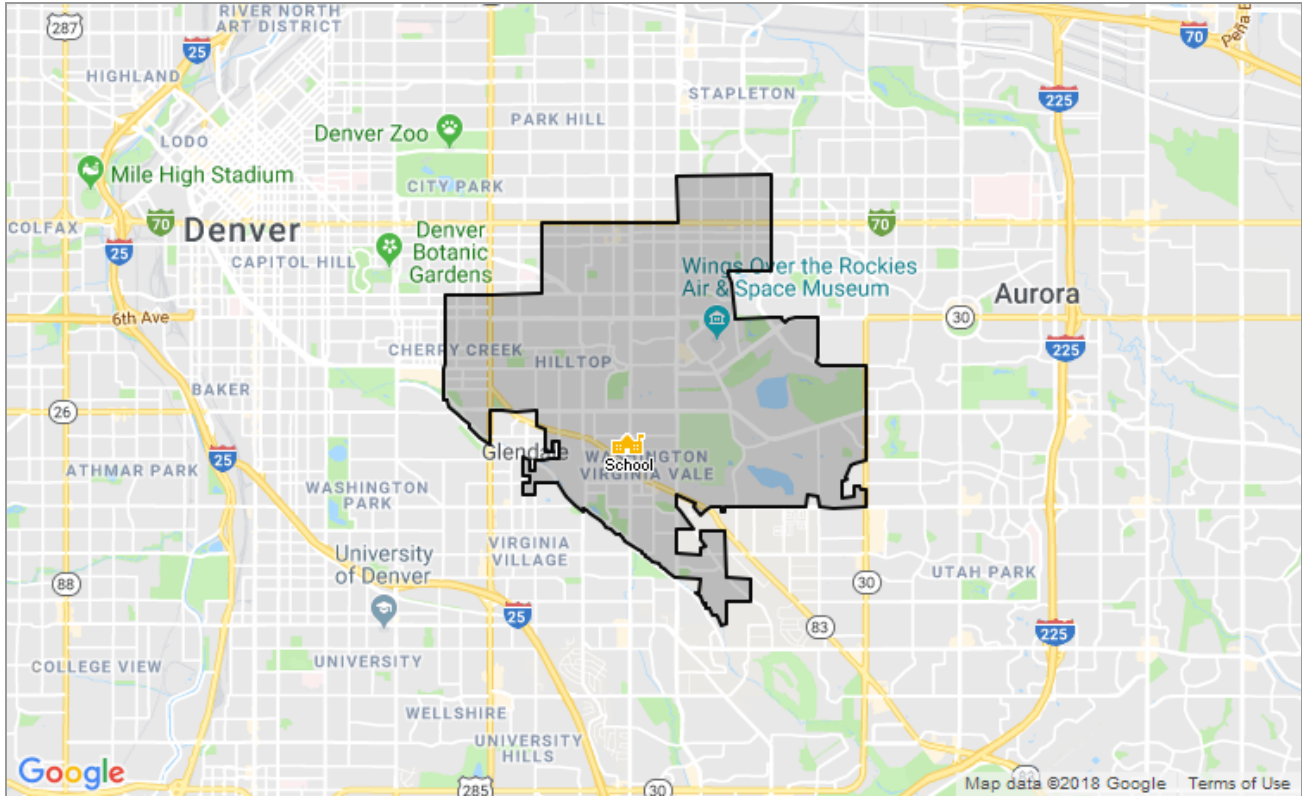

I enjoyed a lot about George Washington. The mid-week block days were nice, I had some really great teachers, and I was grateful for the availability of the IB program. The clubs GW offered that I was a part of were integral to my positive experiences at school, and the school's involvement in the arts, at least early in my high school years, was an amazing part of that. On the other hand, though, there was a fair amount left to be desired. The rift between IB and Traditional programs was not just noticeable, but often problematic. 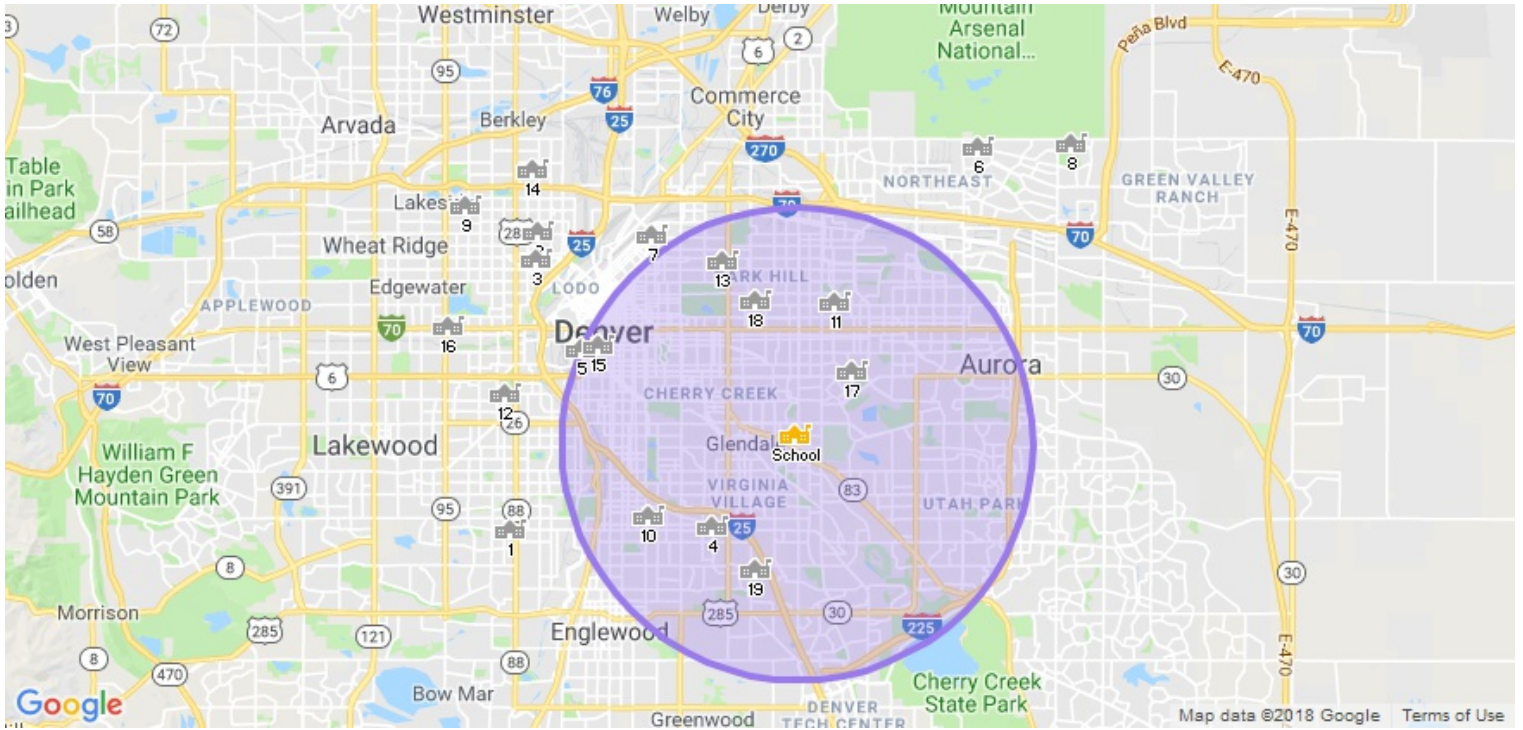
